 - O I teach Library Media/Technology at a public charter school that is part of Baltimore City public school system that serves close to 1,000 students and we are a Title 1 school. The students come from an urban community and the majority of our students receive free and reduced lunch.
- Based on your context, why do you think school-based financial education is important for your students?
 - O The majority of my students come from low-income homes were the caregivers (students come from single parent homes, live with grandparents, etc.) live pay check to paycheck (many who receive financial support). I want to help my students learn early on the skills need to understand positive financial habits and responsibilities (no matter their economic status now and later in life). I work on instilling in my students to push themselves and work hard to get to college and planning for their future.

 - o 5th grade, Media Class

 - o I will be using Vault with one section of students of 24 students

 - O We will begin Vault on April 21, 2017 working on it 1 hour a week until finished (I only see the class 1 hour a week – will add extra sessions if needed to finish within timeline) Throughout course numerous issue came up where the class was not seen beyond my control (teacher was absent class was split so I did not see them that week, etc)
- How often will your students work on the EverFi course? (once a week? Once every other week? Every day for two weeks straight?)
 - O We will be working on it 1 hour a week until finished (I only see the class 1 hour a week will add extra sessions if needed to finish within timeline)
 - With the end of the school year so close and we got behind because of unforeseen issues beyond my control I reached out to parents to have students work on it at home some (those who had computers, etc)
- How will you integrate the EverFi Course into your content?
 - I teach media to entire school of K-8 (varies what grade levels I see and do not see each grading period & school year). We do not have many teachers or opportunities for finical literacy to be taught within a classroom setting. I work with my students to become 21st Century Students and be verse with technology. We are a Project Based School and I am always helping the core content teachers push in with lessons/skills in my classroom. These Finical Literacy course allow me to reinforce practical life skills, technology skills, problem solving and math skills. I can also use the Everfi application to tie in with my digital citizenship lessons and skills we cover throughout the years and grade levels.
- What can you do to ensure learning is happening before, during and after they learn in the EverFi platform?
 - The spring Project Based theme for 5th grade goes into looking at adapting to situations and making choices for your present self and future self. The vault program aligned perfectly with this topic and allowed me to work with the students on a separate topic for presentation. Throughout the program students will be participating in adaptations of the lessons from the teacher's

guide, class discussions, and collaboration using nearpod and then participate in the online vault program. Each student will then be required to create a reflection to accompany their score sheets and certificate if they earn it for their portfolio.

- We recommend planning an "EverFi Certification Day" to recognize students who successfully complete one or more courses. (Personalized Certificates of Completion are available through your account).
 - O What date could you schedule this, and where can you hold it?
 - For those who has finished they will be presented with their certificates during "Wingspan" (school wide celebration day for Project Based Themes that happens once in December and once in May/June) on June 2 because parents will already be invited in on this day. Prior to this day students will have their pictures taken
 - O What will the celebration entail?
 - Students will be called up and presented with a copy of certificate (they will already have a copy for their portfolio) in front of their parents, etc
 - Each child will have picture taken with certificate so that it can be shared via multiple sources that the school use for "Shout Outs"
 - Students will present to their parents their portfolio which has a section about Everfi Vault talk about what they learn, strengths stretches, goals they set for themselves, etc.

 - My classroom is a computer lab so each student has a desktop

 - I have headphones for my computer lab for students to use if they do not bring their own to class.

 - I am the technology teacher so I tend to be the one that is called for "help", however, I have two different Tech Support centers to call if needed (one through my Charter School and one through Baltimore City School District)
 - o If I do run into any Everfi question I know how to contact Everfi

 - I regularly present at professional development at my school on EdTech topics such as game based learning, blended learning, flipped classroom, etc. I have already spoken with the Admin Team and we have put Everfi on the agenda as one of the topics for the return of the next school year PD.
 - o District-wide?
 - I am the current Baltimore City Reading Council President which is part of SoMIRAC (State of Maryland International Reading Council) and plan presentations and workshops we are always looking for ways to find topics that we integrate other content areas into reading so we are planning on have a topic around Financial Literacy this coming Fall and using Everfi
 - I also present at local and state level conferences on EdTech topics and have already reference Everfi within my presentations and plan to keep doing so.

- What impact do you hope EverFi's FinEd course(s) will have on your instruction?
 - I run my media class as a blended learning classroom and use a lot of interactive tools and game based learning. These types of tools and programs allow for the students to get involved and buy into what they are learning and retain the information more. What is nice is the ability to assign a lesson and students can work at their own pace with in the time frame and not have to feel rushed or bored waiting for classmates.
- How will the use of EverFi improve student engagement and achievement at your school?
 - Vault along with the other Everfi topics bring real world topic to life for students who don't always have real word access to it. They can take what they learn and actually apply and manipulate the skills and information that have learned. Resources like Everfi that are interactive and provide a blended learning approach and game based learning increase retention within the students and the students are more into what they are learning. These skills learned through Everfi are ones that the students will use for the rest of their life and are real life skills.

Post-Implementation Reflection:

- How many students in your classes have earned certification?
 - Out of the 24 students that are in the 5th grade section that participated in Vault, 18 became certified. One of the students who did not finish the program because of reoccurring absences and only just started it on the last day they worked on the online modules.. Two of the students who did not earn a certification are students with IEPs (accommodations were provided).
- What went well in your implementation?
 - Having used Everfi numerous times in the past I was familiar with setup and implementing the program. Students are using and reference key vocab and use knowledge and skills learned with appropriate academic talk. I shared with the parents what we were going to be working on and their progress through the time frame were working on it and they were impressed and commented how these skills were fundamental, etc.
- What didn't go well in your implementation?
 - There were sometimes students had problems with the program loading correctly (we used Chrome) and due to loading issues they would have to refresh and a session would have to be restarted so students would get a bit frustrated over that.
 - Some of the modules seem to be longer them others and the students would lose interest time to time and become bored with some of lessons online.
 - Some students didn't realize they kept taking the pretest or the post test over again and not moving on to the next level (I had covered this in the beginning)
- What process and instructional recommendations would you give to other teachers who are

thinking about implementing this resource?

- I recommend to teachers use a uniform login and password formula so students can remember it. For example at my school I have students use their initials number for user name and then we all use the same password.
- I would also recommend some short of check in or share out throughout the lessons.
 I used online discussion boards, online collaboration tools, blog posts and class discussions

 - Since it was towards end of the school year it is a hard time for many of the core
 content teachers to start implementing the program with our end of the year Project
 Based them celebration coming up, etc. What I did was at the different middle school
 grade level team meetings I introduced them to Everfi and the different courses that
 would align with their content standards, etc. For reference into planning for next
 school year.
 - I also spoke with director of the summer camp program that our school runs as a resource that he could use
 - I collaborated with the 4th grade teachers and set up a class for them for their outgoing students for the Summer Slugger program that they will be promoting.
 - It is on the PD agenda for next year start of school year to do a more intensive PD on Everfi and have teachers setup accounts
